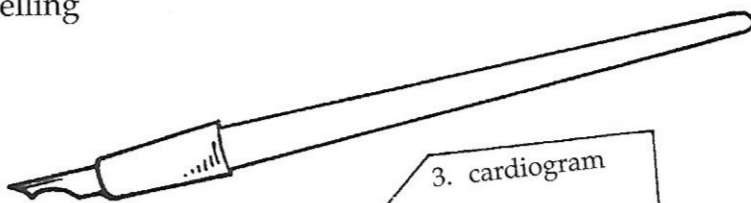


Top Secret
